Signage Placement for your Vote Center

Instructions: Attached is a site-specific picture showing you where to place the signs at your vote center. Follow this guide to place your signs. If you do not have enough signs, report that to your Coordinator, Troubleshooter, and call it in to the Election Worker Hotline at 800-815-2666 Option 7.

The idea with the signs is to make the path the voters should take visible to them and if the accessible path is different than the main path, direct them starting from the point the two paths split, to the vote center. In both cases, the voter should be able to see the next sign from the sign they are standing by. The signs you will be placing are:

Symbol used	Description of Sign	What the sign is for and how to install it	What the sign looks li
Curbside Voting	Blue Sign Symbol	Sign to be placed where the voter will park to get curbside voting assistance. Use the metal stake or tape to a wall/post in this location.	
S	Yellow Sign Symbol	These are your directional signs that will be placed in the ground using the metal stakes. If there is no place to stake the sign, please tape it to a wall/post in this location.	
H	Black Sign Symbol	These are your signs to hang on the fence or wall with tape, if needed. If no fence or wall is available, use your best judgment and place as close to the picture shows as possible.	
VOIE HERE	Feather Flag Symbol	The feather flag is an attention- grabbing sign used to alert the voter that this is a vote center. Use the base or ground stake as appropriate for your location.	
F	Facility Provided Sign Symbol	These signs will be placed by the facility owner to help direct voters. Please do not move these signs. If there is a problem, report it to the Coordinator, Troubleshooter, and Election Worker Hotline.	These signs are each unique and will be pla by the facility owners.
A-F	Specialty Sign Symbol	 "A-Frame" are used when no signs can be hung or staked in the ground. "Accessible Sign" are used to direct voters with disabilities to an accessible route to the Vote Center. 	These signs are each unique, but commonly can look like:
